ELVET ropes and VIP lounges are nothing new to New Yorkers — but private clubs for the preschool set?

The past two years have seen the opening of no fewer than three hot tot spots that are for members only: Kidville, SoHo's Citibabes and Apple Seeds. All boast state-of-the-art indoor playgrounds, cafés, boutiques — and annual fees as high as \$2,000.
